The wide-open field at historic Waterloo Village in Allamuchy — which hosted some of New Jersey's biggest concert events in the 1980s and '90s — is about to get rocked once again.

The popular Bourbon Street Blues Fest recently announced it is relocating to Waterloo for its annual two-day celebration of music, with blues greats Kenny Wayne Shepard and Robert Cray headlining on May 20 and 21, respectively.

This is a repeat of last month's treasurer's report

Treasurer's Report – February, 2017:

2016 was a year of change for the Top O' New Jersey RC Club. We began the year with a balance of \$7,727.00. Our ending balance for 2016 is \$11,130.00 representing an increase in cash of \$3,403.00. For the general budget, Dues and Applications for the year totaled \$8,127 while Operating Expenditures were \$8,806 and represent a reduction in reserves of \$679.00. The AMA Picnic yielded a gain of \$4,082 and was very successful. At the November meeting, we agreed to rebalance the reserves as follows: General Reserve \$3,000, a combined Event Reserve of \$2,000, and the balance of \$6,130 is allocated to the development of the Panther Valley field.

Membership showed a slight decline in 2016, with 109 paying members compared to 112 last year and 113 in 2014.
